2 Cor. 13:14, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all."

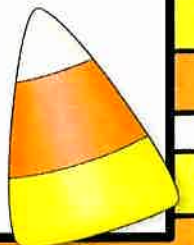
Matt. 28:19, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit."

1 Pet. 1:2, "according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, that you may obey Jesus Christ and be sprinkled with His blood: May grace and peace be yours in fullest measure."

Jude 20-21, "But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith; praying in the Holy Spirit; 2 I keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting anxiously for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to eternal life."

It is a difficult theological truth to understand at any age. Using examples from real life often helps us to understand spiritual truths. St. Patrick used the shamrock to illustrate how 3 parts (leaves) made 1 whole (shamrock).
