As the shepherds returned to their sheep,


they were praising God and saying wonderful things about him. Everything they had seen and heard was just as the angel had said.


Shepherds Visit Baby Jesus





THE MANGER





Where was the stone manger? In Hebrew peasant homes, it was very common for animals to stay inside with the family at night. This kept the animals safe from thieves and heated the house at the same time. Because of this, mangers were built into the floors of many homes. Anyone familiar with Hebrew culture who read the phrase "she laid him in a manger" would assume the birth took place in a private home where the animals lived alongside the family. The historian Gustaf Dalmann stated, "In the East today the dwelling place of man and animal is often in the same room. It is usual among peasants for the family to live, eat, and sleep on a kind of raised terrace in the one room of the house, while the cattle, particularly the donkeys and oxen, have their place below on the actual floor near the door. On this floor the mangers are fixed either to the floor or to the wall, or at the edge of the terrace."

Gold Decorations

Gold symbolizes the Kingship of Jesus. (Ravelations 1:5)

Gifts remind us of the gifts of the Wise Men, and of the greatest gift of all—Jesus.
